Over the weekend, the Office of the Utah State Auditor was made aware of citizen concerns about utility billing and city accounting practices in Eagle Mountain City. As this has recently been brought to our attention, the Office is currently reviewing the complaint to make a determination how best to proceed.

The Office of the Utah State Auditor takes seriously any improper or questionable use of public funds. Any individual who has knowledge of the improper use of public funds can report such concerns to our Hotline, by visiting hotline.utah.gov.
