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The Office of the Utah State Auditor Presents Audit Results for the Minimum School Program

This Morning Results were Presented to the Legislative Public Education Appropriations Subcommittee

Salt Lake City, UTAH -

Today, the Office of the Utah State Auditor presented its latest audit findings on the Minimum School Program to the Public Education Appropriations Legislative Subcommittee. This audit had two objectives:

- Test the FY2012 Minimum School Program (MSP) fund allocations for accuracy and compliance
- Determine whether the FY2014 MSP legislative budget projections were reasonable

The audit tested 10 programs for compliance and reviewed 5 budget projections.

This report identifies 4 key audit findings which result in a projected \$5 million in improper funding allocations in the Minimum School Program for 2012, allocations which are projected to carry forward into 2014 budgeting. In each case, programs either did not use proper historical or actual data, or could not identify the source of data used in their calculations and allocations. This lack of rigor in identifying data that is used to calculate significant funding allocations is a serious problem in an era of streamlined budgets and seems to systematically contribute to over and under allocations of funds within Utah's education system.

The Office recommends that the Utah State Office of Education takes immediate corrective action on these problems.
