Dear Mr. Packer:

We currently have records that are responsive to your request received via email on February 5, 2014 for the "AG Vehicle Usage Audit & Related Emails."

I have attached a copy of the letter from the Office of the Utah State Auditor to the Utah Attorney General, dated January 27, 2014, which delineates the results of our inquiry and analysis of the Office of the Attorney General's assigned vehicles policies and practices (hereinafter referred to as "Letter to the Attorney General." This letter is provided at no cost to you.

Your request for a fee waiver for the compilation of the emails related to our review is denied in accordance with Utah Code 63G-2-203(4). It would take a significant amount of time (approximately 6 hours) to gather the information, which is substantially contained in our Letter to the Attorney General, and we do not feel that this use of government agency time provides additional benefits to the public beyond the results contained in our Letter to the Attorney General. If you wish to pursue the compilation of this information, you may do so at a cost in accordance with Utah Code 63G-2-203.

Pursuant to Utah Code § 63G-2-401, you have the right to appeal the denial of this request to the chief administrative officer, John Dougall, Utah State Auditor. Your notice of appeal must be submitted within 30 days of the above denial date and must include your name, mailing address, daytime telephone number, and an explanation of the relief sought. You may also include any supporting information with your notice of appeal. Your appeal may be submitted at the address listed below.
