The Office of the State Auditor received a Government Access and Management Act (GRAMA) Request from Morgan County. This letter is in response to your GRAMA request dated January 27, 2020 in which you requested the following records:

Request the following records pertaining to Morgan County Audits 2015 to present.

- 1-Date and time of all Complaints and Hot Line Calls dating back to 2015 pertaining to Morgan County Audits.
- 2- Names of all persons filing these complaints and Hot Line Calls.
- 3- Copies of Actual complaint resulting from Hot Line calls.
- 4- All Notifications Sent to or from Morgan County or any of its employees or officials with Dates and from whom it was sent.
- 5- Morgan County's response to notifications.
- 6- Reason for the State Auditors Office taking control of Morgan County's 2019 Audit.

Pursuant to GRAMA, the request for records from Morgan County, a governmental entity under Utah Code 63G-2-103(11)(a)(v), is denied. Utah Code Section 63G-2-206 sets forth the proper procedures by which a governmental entity may share records with another governmental entity. Pursuant to Utah Code 63G-2-401, you have the right to appeal the denial of this request to the chief administrative officer, John Dougall, Utah State Auditor. Your notice of appeal must be submitted within 30 days of the above denial date and must include your name, mailing address, daytime telephone number, and an explanation of the relief sought. You may also include any supporting information with your notice of appeal. Your appeal may be submitted at the address listed below.

Please be aware that all GRAMA requests are posted on our website as a matter of office practice (with personal information, such as address, redacted). We do this to provide transparency and accountability to the public at large.
