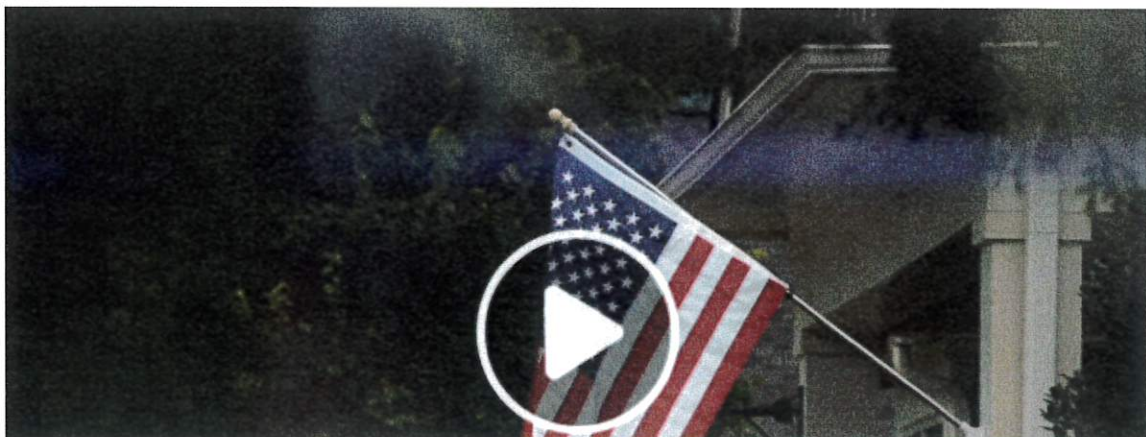


Greetings and Happy Fourth of July!
