As a courtesy to the complainant and to help facilitate a likely referral to the Weber County Auditor, we emailed the Weber County Commissioners requesting their conflict of interest disclosure forms.

12/12/22

The county attorney responded that the commissioner had reported no conflicts upon being elected.

12/28/22

Based on CC'd communication from the Complainant, it appears that Weber County is aware of the complaint. We've determined that this complaint does not directly involve the use of County funds. As such, our current understanding of the limitations described in Utah Code 67-3-1(4)(b) likely applies and we have determined we will not pursue further testwork. Rather, we will refer to the Weber County Auditor, which appears to be the appropriate venue for this Complaint. The Complainant also has the option to submit a complaint to the Political Subdivision Ethics Commission.

We called the County Auditor's Office and spoke with an employee in the Weber County Auditor's Office to let them know we were referring this complaint to them. We then forwarded the email communication to County Auditor Ricky Hatch by email. Further follow up by our Office is not necessary. **Referred.**

Subsequently we communicated our actions to the Complainant.
