Dear Mr. Harvey,

This letter is in response to your Government Records Access and Management Act (GRAMA) request to the Office of the State Auditor (OSA) dated January 23, 2024 in which you requested the following records:

I'm seeking all records and correspondence related to the State Auditor's investigation of the Utah League of Cities and Towns (audit issued in January of 2017) and the subsequent OSA investigation of the Utah Municipal Finance Cooperative (aka Utah Municipal Finance Agency), the Utah Municipal Finance Cooperative II and the Utah Municipal Finance Cooperative II Trust. Please include any interoffice communication about the audit and investigations. Please specifically list any records that are considered privileged under GRAMA or attorney/client privilege. Also, I would like the results of this GRAMA request to come in electronic form .

As permitted by Utah Code Section 63G-2-203(8)(a)(i), we will begin to process your request after we receive payment of the anticipated fee. After we fulfill the request, we will refund any excess. Likewise, we will notify you if it becomes apparent that the fee will exceed the prepaid amount. Included as a separate attachment you will find an invoice that contains payment instructions.

Pursuant to Utah Code § 63G-2-401, you have the right to appeal the denial of this request to the chief administrative officer, John Dougall, Utah State Auditor. Your notice of appeal must be submitted within 30 days of the above denial date and must include your name, mailing address, daytime telephone number, and an explanation of the relief sought. You may also include any supporting information with your notice of appeal. Your appeal may be submitted at the address listed below.

Please be aware that all GRAMA requests are posted on our website as a matter of office practice (with personal information, such as address, redacted). We do this to provide transparency and accountability to the public at large.
