Ms. Candelaria:

I write in response to your GRAMA Request dated May 2, 2024. You requested the following records:

any/all Alleged Government Violations of Utah Code 63G Chapter 31 that have been submitted to State Auditor's office

As you may have read in Auditor Dougall's recent press release, the Office has received tens of thousands of the records you request. The review and any necessary redaction of these records would require countless hours of work.

With this in mind, we have attached around 20 complaints that form a representative cross-section of what the Office has received. Pursuant to *Utah Code* § 67-3-1(17), we have performed minimal redactions of individual information and/or unsubstantiated claims towards governmental entities. However, we have left intact most of the content, including vulgar and suggestive language. We hope this production will serve your organization's purposes. Again, please keep in mind that processing this GRAMA request in the normal course would require members of our team to divert their attention from their usual duties for a considerable amount of time. GRAMA would therefore permit us to charge a fee and demand payment up front. Additionally, 10 business may not be enough time to process the request, so we would likely have to delay production of the records under Utah Code Section 63G-2-204(6)(c)(i).

Please respond to confirm whether the attached complaints suffice. Per our phone conversation, your organization has indicated that this approach will satisfy your GRAMA request. Thank you for your understanding.
